

BOOKS OWNED BY SAPIEHAS, MAGNATES OF THE GRAND DUCHY OF LITHUANIA, AT SCIENTIFIC LIBRARIES OF UKRAINE

The paper is devoted to the rare printed books owned by members of the noble family of the Sapiehas, under the “Fox” coat of arms, and now stored in scientific libraries of Ukraine. The history of the transference of the Sapiehas’ copies to Ukrainian Libraries has been elucidated, and the bibliographical descriptions of these copies are exhibited.

Key words: private book collection, Casimir Leo Sapieha, Jan Fryderyk Sapieha, Paul Bernard Sapieha, Alexander Sapieha, Vilnius Medical-Surgical Academy Library, Berestja Jesuit College Library.

The magnate family of the Sapiehas, under the “Fox” coat of arms, was one of the great noble families of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania and played an important role in its political and cultural life. Its members occupied high positions in the State, wrote books, collected their own libraries. Reconstruction of the history of a private book collection allows to better reveal the personality of its owner and in some cases his philanthropic activities and, to be more specific, to better identify the role of this library in the cultural life of society in a certain epoch. That is why the fate of the books which belonged to the Sapiehas forms an important subject matter of the book science studies and the books themselves – a

rich source for various studies in the area of liberal sciences.

The publication is devoted to the rare printed books owned by the Sapiehas and now stored in the scientific libraries of Ukraine. As a result of the investigation, we can say that 42 editions (42 volumes) with the Sapiehas’ provenance are now preserved in the V. Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine, the Library of M. Hohol Nizhyn State University, the Scientific Library of I. I. Mechnikov of Odessa National University and M. Gorky State Scientific Library in Odessa. The article is a result of a practical investigation of the funds of historical book collections in the V. Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine and information from

the edited catalogues of rare printed books in the mentioned libraries.

“Ukrainian” copies of the Sapihas’ rare books represent the books produced by the printing presses of Amsterdam, Antwerp, Augsburg, Cologne, Frankfurt, Gdansk, Hanau, Krakow, Leiden, Leuven, Lviv, Lyon, Nuremberg, Paris, Pont-a-Musson, Pesaro, Poznan, Rostock, Strasbourg, Venice, Vienna.

According to chronology, these books may be divided as follows: the first half of the 16th century – 6 editions, the second half of the 16th century – 10 editions, the 17th century – 17 editions, the 18th century – 7 editions, and without printer’s imprint – 2 (imperfect/deficient copies). Among them, there are three books printed in the outstanding *Officina Plantiniana* of Antwerp, the printing-publishing business initiated by Christoph Plantin in 1555, one book of the well known Dutch printing-house of the *Elsevier*, and one book of the prominent French typographer and publisher Henry Estein.

Rare books in the “Ukrainian” group are on different subjects – religion, history, politics, literature, philosophy, medicine, mathematics, natural sciences, geography, architecture, the fine Arts (albums of engravings). Among the authors there are statesmen, scientists, philosophers and writers of Ancient Greece and Rome: Plutarch, Euclid, Claudius Galenus, Cicero, Plinius Secundus, Lucretius Carus, Juvenal, Cassius Dio, Pomponius Mela, and authors of the 15th–18th centuries: Italian scientist, architect, historian and theoretician of the fine arts Leon

Battista Alberti (1404–1472), Italian erudite Giovanni Battista Egnazio (1473–1553), German poet and historian Helius Eobanus Hessus (1488–1540), German scientist Cyriac Lentulus (1620–1678), Portuguese physician Abraham Zacutus (1575–1642), French lawyer Jean Boyvin (1580–1650), Dutch cartographers and publishers Ioannes and Guillelmo Blaeu, Dutch erudite Mark Boxhorn (1612–1653) and others.

The research into the history of libraries of the 16th–18th centuries plays an important role in exploring the intellectual atmosphere and the history of culture and science of that time. Both the marginal notes as authentic documents play a distinctive role for the research into the history of libraries.

Analysis of rare books as historical sources shows that copies were in possession of four representatives of the Sapiestas: Casimir Leo Sapieha (1609–1656), Jan Fryderyk Sapieha (1680–1751), Alexander Sapieha (1773–1812) and Paul Bernard Sapieha (1656–1715) and connected with two private libraries of the Sapiestas, located in Ruzhany and Koden estates.

Casimir Leo Sapieha – the youngest son of Leo Sapieha, the Great Clerk of Grand Duchy of Lithuania (1631), the Court Marshal of the Grand Duke, Subchancellor of the GDL, a politician, diplomat, erudite and maecenas, who cuts the most important figure in the history of *Bibliotheca Sapiehana*.

Twenty-seven copies on their pages have writings proving their belonging to the Vilnius Jesuit College Library, Vilnius Jesuit Academy Library (since 1579) as a

donation from Casimir Leo Sapieha. In 1666, an exquisite family collection (about 3 000 books) bequeathed by him in 1665, was delivered to the Vilnius Jesuit Academy (since 1781 the Higher School of GDL, since 1803 the Vilnius University) from the Ruzhany estate. After the Polish November uprising of 1830–1831, the Vilnius University was closed, and on its base two educational institutions were established: the Vilnius Medical-Surgical Academy and the Vilnius Ecclesiastical Academy. The University Library was reorganized. Its fund was distributed among several institutions. Part of it was sent to the Library of Vilnius Medical-Surgical Academy, another one was transferred to the Kyiv St. Volodymyr University Library in 1835 [3, 36] and was included into the library catalogue in 1838.

The “second wave” of the Sapiehas’ copies acquisition to the Kyiv St. Volodymyr University Library occurred with the stock of the Vilnius Medical-Surgical Academy Library which was closed in 1842. The Vilnius Medical-Surgical Library was transferred to Kyiv in 1842–1843 in the number of 17556 volumes [3, 38]. There are 33 editions (33 volumes) with Sapiehas’ provenances in the stock of the V. Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine: at the department of rare printed books and at the department of historical book collections. The historical destiny of rare books was quite different, but all of them came to the V. Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine (at that time the People’s Library of Ukraine) as the stock of the Kyiv St. Volodymyr University Library in 1927

according to the decision of the board of the Peoples Commissariat of Education of August 2, 1926. Now these books are preserved in the book collections at “The Vilnius Medical-Surgical Library” and “The Kyiv St. Volodymyr University Library”, in its structure which is named “Roky”, at the department of historical book collections and in the book collections of the department of rare books: collection of paleotypes (5 editions), a collection of Elsevier editions (1 ed.), collection of Plantin’s editions (3 ed.), collection of editions printed in Latin font (1 ed.). The rare old printed books from the Vilnius Medical-Surgical Library, connected with Sapiehas’ name, have such Latin inscriptions on its flyleaves, mock titles and pages: “Collegii Vilmensis Societatis Jesu dono Illustrissimi Domini Casimiri Sapieha Procancellarii M. D. L.”, “Collegii Vilmensis Societatis Jesu”, “Bibliotheca Academiae Vilmensis”, “Collegii Academici Vilmensis Bibliothecae Magnae”. Five books in this group have supralibros of C. L. Sapieha¹. Their front covers are adorned with the Sapiehas’ coat of arms, the “Fox”, with the owner’s initials arranged around it: K[asimierz] L[eon] S[apieha] P[odkanclerz] W[ielkiego] X[ięstwa] L[itewskiego] S[łonimski] W[ołpensi] L[ubaszowski] S[tarosta] (Casimirus Leon Sapieha, the Subchancellor of Grand Duch of Lithuania, Starosta of Slonim, Volpa, Liuboshany). Except Kyiv, Nizhyn, Odessa, the old printed books

connected with C. L. Sapieha are preserved now in the Vilnius University Library, the Library of Lithuanian Academy of Sciences, the Library of the Russian Academy of Sciences (St. Petersburg) and the Library of Tartu University (Estonia) [1].

Another group of the Sapiehas' copies in the fund of V. Vernadsky National Library of Ukraine are connected with the name of Jan Fryderyk Sapieha. This is a scheme of the "historical way" of these copies to Kyiv: Koden→Berestja→Dorohychyn→Kyiv. Jan Fryderyk Sapieha (1680–1751) – the Grand Recorder of Lithuania (1707–1709), the Castellan of Trakai (since 1716), the Grand Chancellor of Lithuania (after 1735), writer – was a founder of the Jesuit Mission in Koden and donator of the Jesuit College in Berestja. Among the books of the Berestja Jesuit College Library, which was transferred to Kyiv St. Volodymyr University from the Dorohichyn Noble School in 1853 [8], there are ten copies with the marginal notes indicative of J. F. Sapieha's ownership and transferring them to the the Jesuit Mission in Koden and Jesuit College Library in Berestja. The Jesuit Mission in Koden pertained to the Jesuit College in Berestja, and up to 1732 Jesuits only arrived in the Koden Mission on religious holidays [11]. The works donated by J. F. Sapieha were chiefly religious books.

In this group, two books have ownership marks of Felix Owsiany, the Sworder of Volkovysk. The inscriptions say that Jan Fryderyk Sapieha presented these books to Felix Owsiany in 1730, and after some time

Felix Owsiany evidently gave them to the Berestja Jesuit College Library. This fact demonstrates bibliophile connections among representatives of the noble class of society.

Among the books of the Berestja Jesuit College Library there is one which was owned by Paul Bernard Sapieha (1656–1715) – a member of the monastic order of Cistercians, the abbot of Cistercians in Paradyz (in the Poznan diocesis) and Bishop of Zhmud. The copy has leather-bound and gilt edges. There is a bishop's infula tooled on the both covers of the binding. The book is titled "Jesus, Maria, Joseph semina paradisi florigera collecta pro thermis animarum exaedificatis" ([Poznan], 1664) and was written by Augustin Dobrowolski, member of the monastic order of Cistercians. The book has the following provenance: "Ex libris Pauli Bernadi Sapieha R. Paradisi S. B. C. M[agnus] D[ucati] L[it]huaniae] Suppr. Scintor", "Collegii S[ocietatis] Jesu] Anno 1731", "№ 1169. Дорогичинского училища". For the lack of facts, one cannot identify the book's way to the College Library. Did J. F. Sapieha inherit this copy from his uncle, Bishop of Zhmud, or he received it from the Bishop as a gift, and later on, with other books from the Koden Library it was transferred to the Berestja College? It is quite possible that the copy came to the College Library escaping J. F. Sapieha.

When the Vilnius Medical-Surgical Academy was closed, the books from its Library were transferred not only to Kyiv St. Volodymyr University, but also to the Richelie Liceum in Odesa (founded in 1817, from 1865 – Novorosijkyj University). In

1843 4 boxes with books on philological and natural subjects (566 vol.) were delivered to Liceum Library². Among them there were books, which earlier had belonged to the members of the Sapihs family – Casimir Leon and Alexander Sapiuha. Here is a scheme of these books’ “historical way” to Odesa: Ruzhany→Vilnius→Odesa.

Alexander Sapiuha (1773–1812) – a bibliophile, the owner of the library in the Koden estate, member of the Society of the Fellows of Science, the author of numerous papers in geology, geography, ethnography, and publications about standardization of measures and weights in the Commonwealth. In 1810, Alexander Sapiuha presented 6 000 books of his Koden Library to the Society of the Fellows of Science in Warsaw. These copies bear a gift inscription: “Ex Libris Alexandri Sapiuha Principis Societati Regiae Varsaviensi donatis 1810”. The books with provenances of A. Sapiuha, except Kyiv, Odessa and Nizhyn, are now preserved in the Warsaw University Library, the Russian National Library (St. Petersburg), the Library of the Russian Academy of Sciences (St. Petersburg), the Hermitage Library (St. Petersburg) [6].

Five rare printed books with provenances of the Sapiuhas are now preserved in

the stock of the M. Hohol Nizhyn State University Library. This library is one of the oldest scientific-educational libraries of the Left-Bank Ukraine. It was founded in 1820 when the Nizhyn High School of Prince O. Bezborodko was established. The Nizhyn High School was transformed into the Nizhyn Historical-philological Institution of Prince O. Bezborodko, and in 1875, at the leadership’s request, the duplicates of the 16th–19th century editions from the Warsaw University were transferred to the Nizhyn Institution Library [7, 6]. Among them, there were also Sapiuhas’ books.

Here is a scheme of their “historical way” to Nizhyn: Koden→Warsaw→Nizhyn. Four copies bear two variants of engraved bookplates, a mark of ownership to J. F. Sapiuha. The first variant, larger in size, has the following text: “Ex Libris Bibliotheca Codnensis Illustrissimi et Excellentissimi Dni Ioannis Frideri. Comiti Sapiuha Cancellarii Supremi Magni Ducat. Litvania, Capitanei Brestensis 1736”. The second variant, smaller in size, has the following text: “Ex Bibliotheca Codnensi Illmi et Excellmi Ionnis Comitiss Sapiuha SupraCancellaria. M. D. L.”³

The collected information, based on authentic documents, contributes to the knowledge of the fate of the library heritage of one of the most outstanding noble families of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania.

LIETUVOS DIDŽIOSIOS KUNIGAİKŠTYSTĖS DIDIKŲ SAPIEGŲ KNYGOS UKRAINOS MOKSLINĖSE BIBLIOTEKOSE

Santrauka

Straipsnyje nagrinėjamos Lietuvos Didžiosios Kunigaikštystės didikų Sapiegų giminės (herbas Lapė) proveniencinius ženklus turinčios knygos, šiuo metu saugomos Ukrainos mokslinėse bibliotekose: Ukrainos nacionalinėje V. Vernadskio, Nežino valstybinio N. Gogolio universiteto, Odesos nacionalinio I. Mečnikovo universiteto mokslinėje bibliotekoje ir Odesos valstybinėje mokslinėje M. Gorkio bibliotekoje. Pasitelkus euristines paieškas Ukrainos nacionalinės bibliotekos fonduose ir spausdintinius minėtų bibliotekų senųjų leidinių katalogus, galima patvirtinti faktą, kad šiuo metu yra žinomi 42 leidiniai (41 tomas) su nuosavybės ir dovanojimo įrašais bei kitais knygos ženklais. Tie leidiniai priklausė ketu-

riems Sapiegų giminės atstovams: Kazimierui Leonui Sapiagai (1609–1656), Jonui Frederikui Sapiagai (1680–1751), Povilui Bernardui Sapiagai (1656–1715) ir Aleksandrui Sapiagai (1773–1812). Šios knygos į minėtas Ukrainos bibliotekas pakliuvo XIX a. panaikinus arba reorganizavus Vilniaus universitetą, Vilniaus medicinos chirurgijos akademiją, Lietuvos Brastos jėzuitų kolegiją. Knygų su Sapiegų giminės bibliotekų ženklais istorija ir šių knygų kelionių istorija straipsnyje papildyta (žr. priedą) kiekvieno surasto leidinio išsamiu egzemplioriniu bibliografiniu aprašu. Visa ši medžiaga papildoma Sapiegų asmeninių bibliotekų Ružanuose ir Kodenyje (dabar Baltarusija) istoriją ir šių dvarų bibliotekų tolesnį likimą.
